Do you feel strongly about every child's right to play and education?

Are you experienced in volunteer support, recruitment and welfare?

Could you support a team of volunteers in a challenging context to deliver play sessions for children and families on the move?

LOCATION: Calais, France

CONTRACT LENGTH: 10 months (1 month probation) - rolling after 10 months

REMUNERATION: €750 a month, accommodation included.

JOB DESCRIPTION

Join our hard-working grassroots team in providing play and education sessions for children on the move in northern France. You will be joining a team of 4 coordinators and 3 - 8 volunteers, who are collectively responsible for **planning**, **preparing and delivering play sessions in a highly changeable context**.

Alongside facilitating play sessions, you will oversee the recruitment, onboarding and welfare of our volunteers. You will be responsible for ensuring we have a full and qualified team by monitoring the rota, posting and responding to job adverts and interviewing candidates in line with our safer recruitment procedure.

On a new volunteer's arrival, you will oversee their induction and support offer including **organising check-ins**, **arranging additional training and promoting a**



positive team culture.

At Project Play, we say 'we are our volunteers' because the happiness and welfare of our team directly impacts the service we provide; we believe the children we work with deserve the best. As volunteer coordinator, you will organise and facilitate team building days, support the resolution of team conflicts and help volunteers to look after themselves. We have a number of psycho-social support avenues available to volunteers. The volunteer coordinator is there to encourage and support volunteers to make healthy decisions and look after themselves in our demanding context.

The role also has a logistical element, as it requires the individual to **oversee the** team house. This includes monitoring the bed rota, managing issues and overseeing the upkeep and maintenance of the building.

The role is remunerated at a fixed rate of €168 per week to support this, but the organisation cannot cover travel to and from France or other expenses

 Have a working level of both written and spoken French and English Proficient in a relevant language (Kurdish / Arabic / Farsi) Experience in developing safer recruitment or diverse recruitment procedure An understanding of trauma-informed practices, and the impact of trauma and toxic stress on childhood development A valid driving licence and willingness to drive the Project Play van
 Experience working or volunteering in a similar context



ABOUT US

Project Play is a grassroots organisation facilitating structured play sessions for children who are living in informal living sites and accommodation centres across Calais, Grande-Synthe and the surrounding regions. We run sessions six days a week and are looking for a project coordinator to play a vital role in the day-to-day implementation of our service.

In the absence of any such provision from the state, we deliver play and informal education activities for children on the move. We are a friendly, hardworking team who aim to uphold the organisation's principles of collaboration, communication, honesty and mutual respect. Creating a supportive and collaborative team dynamic is vital for our work.

Our sessions are designed to facilitate safe spaces in which children coming through northern France can exercise agency, nurture key developmental skills, build resilience and have fun. Through offering play-based psychosocial support, our team works to assist children and their families to minimise the impacts of toxic stress, trauma and ongoing adversity.
